Success at Melville in 2022 was typified as usual in our performing and visual arts programs, where our students continue to demonstrate outstanding success with works displayed in the Youth Perspectives, YOH Fest, the Melville Arts Awards, The West Australian Pulse 2023 exhibition and the Melville Art Awards and through our swing and concert bands. For the category of scenario writing, students write a 1500-word futurist story based on a selection of topics, and Genese and Finn chose the topic of Neurotechnology.

Finn's entry in particular, was singled out for praise by Thomas Khoo, the Scenario Writing Coordinator, as incredibly powerful and emotional.

#### The Best Teachers

Congratulations to our Principal, Mrs Kylie Bottcher, for being a finalist in the Modern Language Teacher's Association of WA (MLTAWA) Principal's Award and for winning the Chinese Language Special Principal's Award from the Australia China Friendship Society of Western Australia (ACFSWA). These annual awards are designed to honour principals who have made a significant effort towards the encouragement of the study of languages and culture throughout the year.

Ms Stephanie Wignell was nominated by the Chinese Language Teacher's Association of WA for the PCTWA Outstanding Teacher Award. Ms Wignell always goes above and beyond for her students, and received this nomination was a well-deserved recognition!

Mrs Francesca Candaten won second prize in the teachers' competition organised by the Italian Consulate of WA. The competition aims to celebrate the 22nd annual Week of



Italian Language in the World. The focus was on creating classroom activities that integrate technology as a communication tool, using the Italy - Land of Wonders app. Ms Candaten also won the Modern Language Teachers Association of WA's Premier Hilde Dixon Award. It is awarded to an individual who demonstrates excellence in teaching languages, commitment to language education in the classroom, and involvement in language professional associations.

#### **Poster Winners**

Year 7 students Fenella Rich and Caitlyn Jamieson received a Special Commendation in the Western Australian Association of Teachers of Italian (WAATI) 'Fammi un poster' competition. This competition was a great and unique opportunity for the students, as they were encouraged to fully express their creativity and the potential of the Italian language in a free and playful way and to reflect upon their own personal meaning and significance that they give to Italy.

More than 200 entries were presented, and our two students were bravissime!

#### **Mathematics**

### **Problem Solving**

Congratulations to Year 7 student Aarnav Katru, who has been invited to participate in the 2023 Western Australian Mathematics Problem Solving Program (WAMPSP). This elite program provides mathematics classes to able students aged 10 to 15. It challenges students to develop skills in mathematical problem-solving and the logical and effective presentation of solutions to enrich their knowledge of mathematics.

Each WAMPSP class has a Challenge Stage in the first semester and an Enrichment Stage in the remaining semester that runs in partnership with Maths for Young Australians by the Australian Maths Trust.

Students are mainly selected from those who receive an exceptionally high Prize winner or High Distinction in the Australian Mathematics Competition (AMC).

## **Olympiad Success**

In Week 6, keen students tried their hand at the Western Australian Junior Mathematics Olympiad. Students work in teams of four, and upon conclusion, the team scores are added to the individual scores to determine the outcome. It is a two-hour Challenge consisting of 16 problems: 10 in Section A and six in Section B. Only answers are required to the problems in Section A, whereas complete written solutions are needed for problems in Section B.



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


























## **Engineering Program**

In the Term 3 holidays, three Year 8 Melville students attended the WISE Engineering Program for five days. Hana Moosajee, Shani Ariyaratna and Jasmine Gosain wrote about their adventures below.

We were very excited to attend the WISE Engineering Program for girls in Years 8 to 12. We explored skills to do with the up-and-coming oil and gas engineering industry. We even saw the work these industries conduct through site visits to places like Clough, Sub con,

Woodside, Oceaneering, ERGT and UWA Oceanworks.

Each day guest speakers gave us informative lectures on their work in the engineering field and how we can be a part of the industry's future. We also learnt how to master things like public speaking and how to use social media, and we had a lesson on self-confidence, which are all essential tools.

One of our favourite parts was the visit to ERGT, a training centre that provides first aid, safety, and emergency training courses relevant to a wide range of high-risk industries. We got to watch professionals put out real fires (purposely lit), sit in a helicopter, learn about surviving if we ever get stranded in the ocean and many other interesting things. We also very much enjoyed our visit to Woodside Energy, where we learnt

about how energy production affects climate change and what is being done to change that. We played a game to switch coal and gas energy to wind and solar energy with the resources we were given. This taught us how to adapt and make do with what we have, just like in the real world

One of our most informative lectures was about Geo-technical Engineering, a branch of civil engineering focusing on the design of structures and their interaction with the soil.

Female guest speakers inspired us in an engineering industry careers lecture

to outline a day in their job based on their engineering profession.

We got to talk to civil, industrial, structural, chemical, and electrical engineers. We also had the amazing opportunity to have one-on-one time to speak with each of them and ask them questions. This gave us much knowledge about what different types of engineers do and what engineering career sounds the most appealing to us.

Overall, we are incredibly grateful for this opportunity, as many young girls don't know much about the engineering industry. We learnt so much in the five days and, we highly recommend the program to girls interested in engineering or wanting to know more about this vast and amazing industry!

Congratulations to the Year 7 Science class of Ms Annie Sprivulis, who won the Murdoch University Biokemon class competition and won \$500.




































#### Music in Focus WA Schools' Festivals
